

Learning Objectives: The primary functions will include:

1. Supporting activities that advance the work of the Division and Center
2. Contributing to the development of communication materials for programs, country offices, awareness events, and campaigns
3. Participating in evaluation of communication products and processes to identify best practices and improvements in communicating with various intended audiences and to enhance messaging from the Division.

The participant will also receive training and mentorship in plain language writing to communicate scientific information to non-technical audiences, message development for a variety of communication channels (social media, web, reports, etc.), providing communication technical assistance to DGHP staff, performance management and evaluation, and implementation across a wide range of global health security issues.

Anticipated Appointment Start Date: August 15, 2022. Start date is flexible and will depend on a variety of factors.

Appointment Length: The appointment will initially be for one year, but may be renewed upon recommendation of CDC and is contingent on the availability of funds.

Level of Participation: The appointment is full-time.

Participant Stipend: The participant will receive a monthly stipend commensurate with educational level and experience.

Citizenship Requirements: This opportunity is available to U.S. citizens and Lawful Permanent Residents (LPR).

ORISE Information: This program, administered by ORAU through its contract with the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) to manage the Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education (ORISE), was established through an interagency agreement between DOE and CDC. Participants do not become employees of CDC, DOE or the program administrator, and there are no employment-related benefits. Proof of health insurance is required for participation in this program. Health insurance can be obtained through ORISE.

The successful applicant(s) will be required to comply with Environmental, Safety and Health (ES&H) requirements of the hosting facility, including but not limited to, COVID-19 requirements (e.g. facial covering, physical distancing, testing, vaccination).
