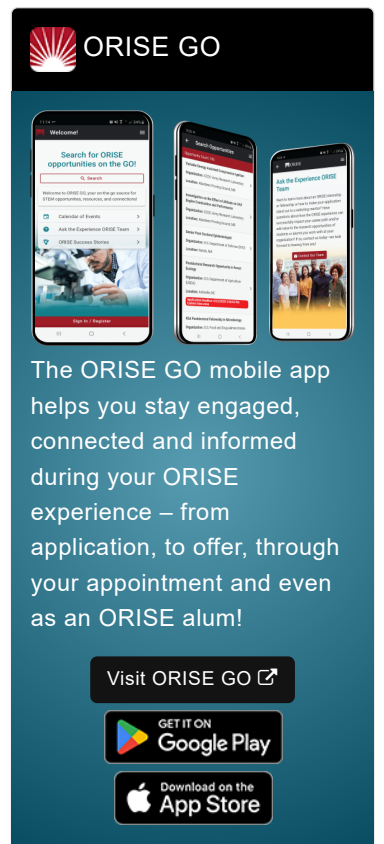


The CDC Workplace Health Program provides leadership to improve the health, safety, and well-being of employees through science-based workplace health promotion programs.

Research Project: The research participant will collaborate with program Health Scientist and Project Officers who lead the Closing the Gap: Social Determinant of Health (SDOH) Accelerator grant program and related activities, support SDOH research and other branch program planning activities, and develop special projects that aim to increase the implementation, uptake, and scale of all PRTB programs and research findings into public health practice for maximum health impact.

- Train alongside branch, division, and center workgroups and participate in the support of subject matter experts in SDOH
- Learn the principles of providing programmatic and evaluation technical assistance to recipients
