**Description** The Appalachian STEM Academy at Oak Ridge is a one-week, fully funded, hands-on learning experience for Appalachia's middle school students. Hosted by Oak Ridge Associated Universities in Oak Ridge, Tennessee, the program is a gateway to science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) in the Appalachian region. Many participants come from economically distressed counties and gain increased exposure to applied science and STEM education through this experience. Middle school students develop skills in emerging STEM technologies with master teachers. As an entrepreneur, students then identify and analyze relevant community issues within the Appalachian region and develop solutions using STEM technologies. The program culminates in a final group presentation where participants showcase their work.
